Instead of luring parents to PTA meetings with "goodie bags," federal, state and local governments should consider paying qualifying parents (income-based) who have one or more children attending grades K-12 public schools \$7,500 per student per year (perhaps capping the offer at two children) if the student successfully advances with 90 percent attendance and a B average. Nothing motivates like cold, hard cash.

This would guarantee better attendance and higher grades but also give households a leg up from chronic poverty.
